#### **THE APPLICATION**

I have before me an application from the Tokoroa High School for the grant of a Special Licence pursuant to s.138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol for the premises situated at 40-60 maraetai Road and known as Tokoroa High School.

The application is for a special licence for 2 events as follows:

The Inspector has filed a positive report and recommends the grant of the Special Licence subject to conditions.

The New Zealand Police and Medical Officer of Health have not raised any matters of opposition.

## **DECISION**

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard in s.105 and s.142 of the Act, and I am satisfied that this application meets the Purpose and Object of the Act. Accordingly, I grant the special licence (17/SP/083/2017) which may be issued immediately. Conditions will apply to the licence.

## **REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The applicant has previously operated Special Licences without incident.

Substantive food and free water will be available throughout the event.

The comprehensive report of the Inspector indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health raises any matters in opposition.

The South Waikato District Council does not currently have a Local Alcohol Policy.

There is nothing in the application which would suggest that the Applicant will supply alcohol in any way which would be inconsistent with the intention of the Act, or any other relevant legal requirement.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in  $\rm s.105~\&~142$  of the Act.

# **CONDITIONS**

- 1) Alcohol may be sold and supplied under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:
- 2) The entire premises for both events is designated "Supervised".
- 3) Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
- 4) The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
- 5) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol. Food should be actively promoted.
- 6) The licensee must ensure that the special licence is visible to patrons and displayed at the principal entrance on the licensed area.
- 7) The licensee must provide an alternative form of safe transport for the attendees.
- 8) No sale of alcohol is to take place after the designated closing time as stipulated on the licence, that being 12:00am (midnight)
- 9) The entire licensed area is to be vacated within 30 minutes of the bar closing, that being 12:30am (the following day) unless that persons presence is justified, such as restocking and cleaning.
